Learning about what the Ozona Chamber of Commerce does and offers were the subjects of the July Lunch & Learn at the Ozona Chamber of Commerce Visitor Center

Chamber President, Shanon Biggerstaff and Interactive Media Coordinator Cathy English both made presentations about what services the chamber offers to its members.

"There are a lot of misconceptions out there about chambers. Chambers are not civic organizations. We have a paid staff with a board of directors," Biggerstaff said. "A lot of people don't understand that we are a corporation. We are bound by federal laws and guidelines."

In the state of Texas there are 600 chambers of commerce, Biggerstaff said. Each chamber operates based on the specific needs of their community.

"Our job is to be the front door to the community and their businesses. We support those businesses that come into town and market those services to residents. We support local businesses," Biggerstaff said.

The chamber deals with an average of 120 phone calls a month.

Biggerstaff said the Ozona Chamber's focus is on the two industries that provide the economic base for Ozona: the oil and gas, and tourism industry which consist of travelers that stop for gasoline. eating and spending time in the community.

The chamber has created a GPS game that gives visitors a 60-90 minute tour of Ozona by using a GPS, and a historical walking tour.

They also get information out through their website Ozona.com, social media on Facebook, Twitter, Pinterest and Instagram, email and monthly newsletters.

The chamber has 3,200-5,000 hits every month on their website.







"People are staying with us. They are remembering us and talking about us," Biggerstaff said.

This year the chamber is hosting their annual Oil and Gas Show in October. They host this event every other year.

"This serves a purpose to support the number one service in the county, it puts people in the community in hotels and restaurants and it's a fundraiser for the chamber," Biggerstaff said.

The Ozona Chamber is funded through dues, the local motel occupancy tax which is used to promote tourism in Crockett County, and fund raisers.

They also have a board of directors. Each board member serves three years and can serve for two consecutive terms.

"We work very well together. A board member's position cannot be self-serving. You must be willing to serve the community," Biggerstaff said.

English showed participants how they can get the most from their membership by using their ChamberMaster account through Ozona.com.

Every chamber member has their own account to ChamberMaster. Through ChamberMaster the business can update their information, post about events, hot deals and it also has a social networking aspect.

Other chamber benefits include ribbon cuttings and promoting new businesses, grand opening ceremonies, low cost seminars and workshops, special recognitions, networking, educational and training opportunities, hunting lease marketing, business referrals and leads, advocacy, relocation and information packets, chances to visit with legislators and opportunities for involvement.
